Do the Following Problems.

1. There are 8 toys in a box. Timmy added 3 more toys, and then his sister took 2 toys to play with. How many toys are left in the box?
2. Jenny has 6 marbles, and Mike has 4 marbles. How many more marbles does Jenny have than Mike?
3. There are 15 candies. Amy wants to share them equally among her 3 friends. How many candies will each friend get?
4. There are 9 flowers in a garden. Sony planted 5 more flowers. She wants to arrange them in groups of 4. How many groups can she make, and how many flowers will be left?
5. Mark has 12 pencils. He gave 5 pencils to his sister and 3 pencils to his friend. How many more pencils does Mark have than his friend?
6. Jessica has 8 stickers, and Maria has 6 stickers. If they combine their stickers, how many stickers do they have in total, and how many more stickers does Jessica have than Maria?

7. There are 7 birds on a tree. 2 more birds join them. How many birds are there in total, and can they be grouped into pairs?
8. Peter had 9 balloons. He let 4 of them go. How many balloons does Peter have now, and can you count them backward?
9. Billy has 8 dollars. He spends 3 dollars on a toy and 2 dollars on a snack. How much money does he have left?
10. Katie buys a toy for \$8 with a \$20 bill. How much change should she receive?
11. In a zoo, there are 6 lions. Each lion has 3 cubs. How many legs do all the lions and their cubs have together?
12. Emma's ribbon was 15 inches long. She cut off 5 inches and then used 3 inches for a craft project. How much ribbon does she have left?
13. There are 4 shelves, and each shelf can hold 6 books. How many books can the bookcase hold in total?
14. The school day starts at 8:30 AM and ends at 3:00 PM. How many hours and minutes are there in the school day?
15. In the art corner, there are 12 paintbrushes. If 7 more paintbrushes are brought in and then 4 are taken away, how many paintbrushes are left?
